Students in Young 5s through 2nd grade will continue to receive their weekly packets in the mail for the remainder of the school year. These are required learning for students. In grades 3 through 8, students' first priority is to complete the online work in Google Classroom. Once they are finished with those online assignments, they should complete the packet. Physical education, music, and computers are supplemental learning. Students are not required to complete supplemental learning, but it is an option for them to do. Many teachers have offered supplemental opportunities in addition to the work that is required. Please contact your child's homeroom teacher if you have specific questions.
